"Kings of the North Against the Kings of the South"

- 1. Ptolemy I Soter and Seleucus I Nicator Daniel 11:5
- 2. Ptolemy II Philadelphia and Antiochus II Theos Daniel 11:6
 - a. Ptolemy established a treaty with Antiochus II Theos with the marriage of his daughter Berenice.
 - b. Ptolemy had Antiochus divorce his wife Laodiceia to marry Berenice.
 - c. Antiochus took back Laodiceia after the death of Ptolemy.
 - d. Laodiciea murdered Antiochus and Berenice.
- 3. Ptolemy III and Seleucus Callinicus Daniel 11:7-9
 - a. Ptolemy III came against Seleucus Callinicus in revenge for the murder of Berenice.
- b. Seleucus sought to regain dominance over Egypt but was unable to do so.
- 4. Antiochus III and Ptolemy Philopater Daniel 11:10-19
 - a. Seleucus III tried to break Egyptian domination but died in battle before the conquest was complete.
 - b. Military conquest was completed by Antiochus III.
 - c. There were three attempts by the south to regain dominance over the land of Israel and Syria; but without lasting success.
 - d. There was a marriage alliance established between Antiochus III and the son of Ptolemy with his daughter Cleopatra.
 - e. There were numerous attempts by Antiochus to conquer territory to the west (particularly Greece).
- 5. Seleucus Philopator Daniel 11:20
 - a. Seleucus IV Philopater ruled between Antiochus III (Great) and Antiochus Epiphanes.
 - b. Seleucus was noted for his oppression of the Jews through taxation.
 - c. Seleucus mysteriously was poisoned and eventually replaced by Antiochus IV.
